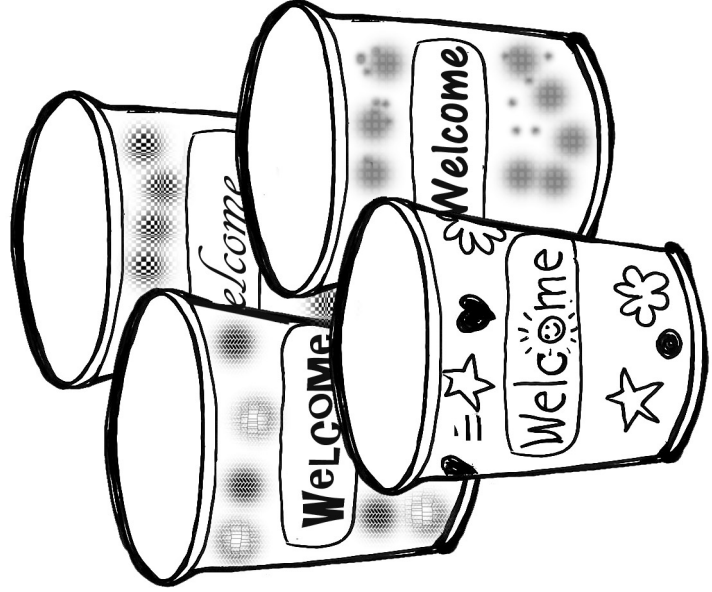
Welcome Cups
