Long ago in Bible times, God's people worked hard for a mean king. But God had a plan to help them. Moses was an important part of God's plan. Moses knew about the king. Moses had run away from the king and was living in the desert, caring for sheep. One day Moses decided to go up on a mountain.

There on the mountain, Moses saw something amazing – a bush. Not an ordinary bush, but a bush on fire! Not an ordinary bush on fire, but a bush on fire that didn't burn up!

# ACTIVITY

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A labyrinth is a path that people move along to help them listen to what God wants to say to them.

1. Think of a question you would like to ask God.
2. Begin at the starting place and slowly trace your finger along the path of the labyrinth. Think about your question as you move your finger.
3. When you get to the middle, stop for a moment and think about what God might be saying to you.
4. As you trace your way out of the labyrinth, keep thinking about your question.
5. When you are at the start again, sit quietly for a moment and think about your question and any new thoughts you have about it.

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
